



1. CHAMPIONSHIPS

1.1. THE AUTOTEST/12-CAR /SCATTER/PCT CHAMPIONSHIPS

1.1.1. QUALIFYING EVENTS

Any MSA approved event in the categories above including any held under a waiver of permit.

1.1.2. CONDITIONS

- a) To be eligible to score points a BLCC sticker must be visible on competing vehicles and where permissible entered as the contenders club.
- b) Marshal or officiate on at least one MSA event of any discipline.

1.1.3. SCORING

Points will be awarded on the basis of position in dass for Auto-tests and Pcts and on o/a for 12-Car and Scatter rallies as follows: -

1st 10 points

2nd 9 points

For 3 rd and lower placing points will be reduced successively by 1 point for each place down to a minimum of 2 points.

Each sub sequent finisher will be awarded 2 points

Each eligible non-finisher will be awarded 1 point.

N.B. Points will only be awarded to the driver and one other nominated passenger where applicable. In the event of a tie the winner shall be the member who scored the most 10s, then 9s, etc., until a winner is found. If this method fails to find a winner then the Championship shall be shared.

1.2. SPRINT CHAMPIONSHIP

1.2.1. QUALIFYING EVENTS

Any MSA approved Sprint event.

1.2.2. CONDITIONS

- a) To be eligible to score points a BLCC sticker must be visible on competing vehicles and where permissible entered as the contenders club.
- b) Marshal or officiate on at least one MSA event of any discipline.

1.2.3. SCORING

Points will be awarded on the basis of position in dass as follows: -

50 points for 1 st in class

48 points for 2 nd in class

For 3 rd and lo wer placing, points will be reduced successively by one point for each place down to a minimum of 10 points.

Each sub sequent finisher will be awarded 10 points

Each eligible non-finisher will be awarded 5 points.





1.3. STAGE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

1.3.1. QUALIFYING EVENT S

Any MSA approved stage rally event.

Any MSA approved / recognised International stage rally event

1.3.2. CONDITIONS

- a) To be eligible to score points a BLCC sticker must be visible on competing vehicles and where permissible entered as the contenders club.
- b) Marshal or officiate on at least one MSA event of any discipline.

1.3.3. **SCORING**

Points will be awarded on the basis of position in dass as follows: -

30 points for 1 st in class

28 points for 2 nd in class

For $3^{\,\rm rd}$ and lower placing, points will be reduced successively by one point for each place down to a minimum of 10 points.

Each subsequent finisher will be awarded 10 points

Each eligible non-finisher will be awarded 5 points.

1.4. ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

1.4.1. QUALIFYING EVENTS

Any MSA approved road rally event.

1.4.2. CONDITIONS

- a) To be eligible to score points a BLCC sticker must be visible on competing vehicles and where permissible entered as the contenders club.
- b) Marshal or officiate on at least one MSA event of any discipline.

1.4.3. SCORING

Points will be awarded as follows: -

100 for 1st o/a

96 for 2 nd o/a

For 3 rd and lower placing, points will be reduced successively by two points for each place down to a minimum of 10 points.

Each subsequent finisher will be awarded 10 points

Each eligible non-finisher will be awarded 5 points.

1.5. MARSHALS CHAMPIONSHIP

The Marshals trophies one male and one female will be awarded by the following points system: -

The start within 50 miles of the clubhouse = 1 point

The start within 150 miles of the dubhouse = 2 points

The start beyond 150 miles of the clubhouse = 3 points

Organisers and sector marshals are entitled to double points

PR crews are entitled to treble points

The onus is on the contender to claim points.

2. AREA ASSOCIATIONS

Bexley Light Car Club is a member of the following Associations: -

- Association of South Eastern Motor Clubs (ASEMC)
- London Counties Association of Motor Clubs (LCAMC)
- Association of Eastern Motor Clubs (AEMC)





- Association of Central Southern Motor Clubs (ACSMC)
- Association of South Western Motor Clubs (ASWMC)
- East Midl ands Association of Motor Clubs (EMAMC)

These Associations serve a number of administrative purposes, such as exchange of information about events, and as a link with the MSA to represent concerted views on matters of common interest.

For the various club members, however, the main benefits arise from the different championships run by each Association. In each championship some form of registration is required, details of which can be obtained from the competitions secretary.

Apart from the chance of winning one of the Association championship awards, the main benefit to the ordinary club member is the ability to enter any championship event, even if the club is not invited. This gives a considerably wider scope of events over a large part of the South and East of England, all of which count towards the various BLCC club Championships.

Details for qualifying events for Association Championships will be published from time to time in the BLCC magazine. Please make sure that you obtain and read your copy.

Names and addresses of the various secretaries can be obtained from the Competitions Secretary.

3. THE WEALD MOTOR CLUB

Bexley Light Car Club Ltd is also a member of the above named club and as such this entitles our entire dub membership to participate in any event organised by the Weald Club.

The Weald Motor Club, which comprises of most if not all of our neighbouring car clubs, enables a much broader range of Clubman type event, 12 cars, scatters, autotests and production car trials. Results in these events qualify for the BLCC club Championship awards.

If members need any information regarding the Weald Club, their rules, or any event dates, Please contact the competition secretary.





4. BEXLEY LIGHT CAR CLUB (LIMITED)

4.1. General Championship Rules

The championship season will run from the 1st January to the 31st December each year.

Contenders must be full members of Bexley Light Car Club Ltd. The onus is on the contender to ensure that the competitions secretary has a copy of results for events from which the championship tables will be compiled. Tables will be published in the dub magazine at regular intervals.

Claims for omissions, errors, etc. will not be acceptable after one calendar month of the publication of the tables in the magazine covering the relevant period. The qualifying period for claims, etc., after the final tables have been published is two weeks. The final tables will be posted in the clubhouse on the first club night of the New Year.

Only the secretary of the meeting (not entries secretary), clerk of the course, PR officer and chief marshal constitute an organiser of an event for the purpose of claiming championship points.

Any query as to the interpretation of the rules for the various championships will be referred to the committee of Bexley Light Car Club Ltd. for a ruling, which shall be final and binding. The committee reserves the right of adjudication.

Rules for individual championships supersede all previous editions and apply from 1st January 2005.

No championship award, other than marshalling trophies may be won solely on organiser's points.
